Information on the courses- Winter Semester CEC 23/2/2014

Hebrew: Sunday at 19:00 or Wednesday 19:00 (level 4)

The CEC offers Hebrew classes for four levels:

- Beginners (no knowledge of Hebrew at all)
- Intermediary (basic spoken Hebrew, an ability to communicate in simple Hebrew, but no or very little reading or writing
- Advanced (able to communicate in Hebrew, understanding of the alphabet and ability to read and write very basic texts)
- High level Hebrew (able to communicate in Hebrew, understanding of the alphabet and ability to read and write very basic texts) Wednesdays at 19:00

The class will focus on spoken Hebrew, and the ability to communicate in different aspects of life: stores, buses, authorities, apartment rental and contracts, medical issues, work issues and employers, and with Israelis in every day encounters. the class will meet for two hours every Sunday and will focus on conversation, reading and writing and practicing skills. Students can also attend a practice session on Wednesdays. students will receive written materials for reading, practice and homework.

English: Monday 19:00 at the CEC

Two levels:

1- Basic

2- Intermediary

The class will focus on spoken English, and the ability to communicate in different aspects of life: stores, buses, authorities, apartment rental and contracts, medical issues, work issues and employers, and in every day encounters. The class will focus on conversation, reading and writing and practicing skills.





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Photography: Monday 19:00

Students need to have a camera!

1- Basic Photography: The course is for beginners, and is an opportunity to learn basic techniques of using a camera as well as how to take pictures. Additionally to the basic use, the course will focus on using photography as a special language, global language based on the visual, known and understood by all.

The course will give you the opportunity to learn some advance principles of this visual language, using the camera. We will learn to use this language in order to tell a story or to present a thought - to communicate ourselves to the other.

2- Advanced Photography level 3- for the students who took the intermediate course in the Fall semester (Liat and Miki's class)

3- Advanced Photography level 4- Photojournalism and documentary photography - for students who studied in the past, the advanced level class (Yael's class)

Documentary video course- Tuesday 19:30

Video cameras allow us to document our life and the lives of the people around us. Video enables us to draw -- in moving pictures -- reality as we experience it, and as we understand it. Nothing parallels first person documentation and storytelling.

The documentary video course will provide basic tools in video filming and video editing, as well as the making of short films in which the students document significant moments in their lives and the lives of their family members and friends; moments of hardship and worry as well as personal and communal joy. Students will document events taking place at home, at work and in the public sphere. During the course, we will watch documentaries from Africa, the Middle East and the West. We'll develop raw ideas into short finished films and watch the videos made by the students.





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Computer Courses:

Basic Computers: Monday 18:45

The course aims to give an introduction to computers in the most basic operations of the computer. The students will get introduced to the computer main parts and the method of working with the operating system including first steps of using the internet and the office applications (word & power point).

Computer technician level 1: Sunday 18:45

The course is based on the content from Cisco courses and brings to the participants the concepts related to computer hardware and how the computer is working. Along with theoretical knowledge, the participants acquire practical tools to repair computer hardware.

Computer technician level 2: Thursday 18:45

In this chapter, the course will explore the purpose of an operating system, describe and compare operating systems to include purpose, limitations, and compatibilities. Students will install an operating system and will apply common preventive maintenance techniques for operating systems including troubleshoot operating systems.

Computer technician level 3: Monday 18:45

The course will explore what to consider when purchasing a printer, and how to connect printers to an individual computer or to a network. It will also include an overview of network principles, standards, and purposes plus understand computer and network security.

Photoshop level 1 Wednesday or Thursday 19:00





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Learning the basics of how to use photoshop, which is used to design adds, pictures, invitations, etc'. The course will focus on beginners level and will offer basic techniques of the program.

Conditions: to know basic use of computers and internet.

Photoshop level 2 Sunday 19:00

For students that studied photoshop level 1 in the previous semester, this course will advance your level and capabilities in the program (Dana's class)

Sound Technician: Sunday 19:00

How to work a sound system used at public events, such as concerts, weddings, shows, etc'.

Getting to know the different elements that comprise a sound system, how to construct it, balance sound and how to work the system.

Sewing: Wednesday 18:30

Basic techniques in sewing and how to work a sewing machine.
